Reflecting on The Pew Study & Looking Forward: Becoming a Warm, Welcoming Community of Growth, Meaning and Purposeful Life

By now, most in our community have read or heard about the Pew study of American Jewry. Countless words and blog articles have washed over the Internet, analyzing and dissecting the recent report on the state of American Jewry and Judaism in America. Over the past months, I have shared my perspective with the EBJC Family on Shabbat mornings. There is little doubt that the report has hit a nerve with the American Jewish Community, but there should also be no doubt that this report offers us, the American Jewish Community an opportunity. The Pew report allows us this moment to reflect on our successes and deficiencies and look forward to building on those successes and reversing the shortcomings.

Then successes of Conservative Judaism in America as found in the Pew study was recently capsulized by my colleague Alan Silverstein:

. . .the data describing self-identified Conservative Jews reflects relative stability rather than decline, when compared to years ago. Ninety-eight percent are proud to be Jewish, with **93 percent feeling that “being Jewish” is “important” in their lives. Eighty-three percent have some Jewish friends, more than 90 percent regard Israel as an “important part of being Jewish,” 88 percent feel an “emotional attachment to Israel,” and 56 percent have been to Israel** at least once. There are relatively high percentages for belief in God, raising their children as **“Jewish by religion,” synagogue affiliation, attending religious services, sending children to day school, maintaining a kosher home, and other markers of strong religious identity.**

The number of self-identified Conservative Jews has not **“plummeted.” They number 954,000 adults and at least 200,000 children, for a total of 1,150,000.** This remains quite a substantial amount . . .

The static number of our Movement can be traced to a number of variables including the demographic challenges facing many communities such as ours. While Jewish communities are growing, they are not always growing in places where our synagogues exist. The challenge to the Conservative Movement is to seed new congregations in growing Jewish population centers and nurturing a new generation that is seeking meaningful and purposeful Jewish life.

There are challenges for our EBJC Family as well. For a generation we took for granted the needs of the local Jewish community and families. Over the coming months and years we need to engage in a conversation about the future and nature of the EBJC. The EBJC needs to become a synagogue center, where people will build life long relationships with Prayer, Learning, Social Action, Israel, Jews around the world and Jews in our neighborhood. In this way, the EBJC will be a warm, welcoming community of growth, meaning and purposeful life.

The journey is just beginning, but as you join with us the rewards will be great for us as a community and each of us as individuals.

They also support our Shul in many other ways and we are proud to honor their contributions at **this year's gala. As a special treat, we will be raffling a trip to Israel. We are only selling** 500 tickets to give each ticket a 1 in 500 chance of winning. We are looking forward to a very exciting and enjoyable evening.

We have been and still are working very hard in getting a new tenant to replace the Schechter School. Another new project we are starting is a singles group which would include many other Synagogues in the area. There are plans underway for an inter-generational mural for the halls leading to our offices. More information should be forthcoming for this as well. All of this is in addition to the daily functions and programs of our Shul. Eric and I are very interested in hearing from congregants. Please let us know if you have suggestions for other programs or if you are interested in working on some of our current ones.

On Yom Hashoa, 27 Nissan, Sunday evening, April 27, 2014, Rabbi Finkelstein plans to have a rededication of this unique display of Yizkor-rememberence - One hundred (100) named children representing one and one half million Jewish children murdered in the Shoah.

A personal note: although I was chair of the EBJC Yad Veshem Committee and brought the Holocaust Torah which we have on display in the lobby and ran the campaign which resulted in the 6 candelabra now on the back wall of the sanctuary and set up the EBJC Holocaust section in the East Brunswick public library, I was not asked to work on this project. It was a complete surprise to me. However when co-presidents Sol Hecht and Jack Steinweis asked me to take over the project of course I accepted. I found it in disarray **but with Raymond Sasson’s help we found pieces of the puzzle and I was fortunate to** discover the Simon Wiesenthal Museum as a source of Holocaust children with a few from the U.S. Holocaust museum and Yad Vashem. Reading the many bios was a sad and, frequently, tearful experience. Another experience, unexpected, was the very slow pace **of congregants coming forth and adopting children, but all’s well that ends well and we** now have completed this sacred task.

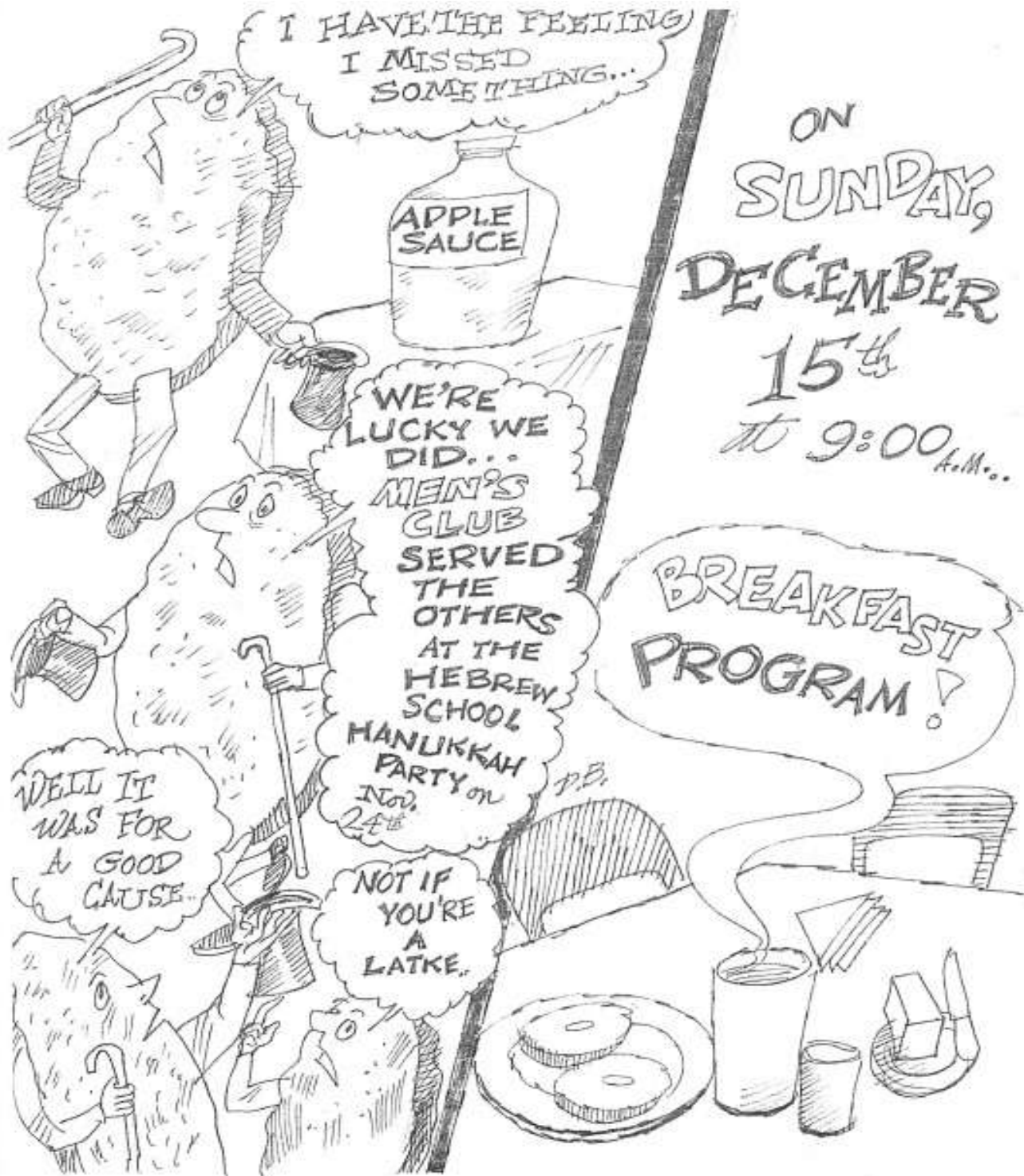
